This is your Association and your Convention.

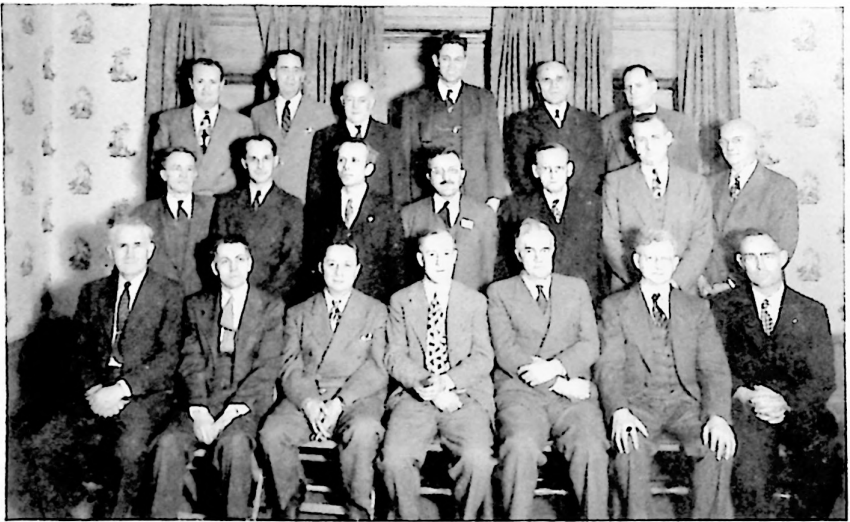

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF YOUR HOST CLUB— BUFFALO NUMISMATIC ASSOCIATION

The Buffalo Numismatic Association, better known locally as "The Coin Club" has an history not greatly differing from that of many similar organizations. However, being one of the older clubs, the record of its work and operation will be of definite interest. We should examine a coin club in terms of its growth, its usefulness, its contributions and the caliber of its members.

One winter day in the year 1926, Robert H. Lloyd, encountered Mr. Fred H. Becker, now resident at Lakeland, Florida in the store of Mr. John B. Aldred on Main Street, Buffalo. As Mr. Aldred was for years the only coin dealer in this city, it became a meeting place of collectors of stamps and coins. Mr. Becker had compiled a list of residents of the Niagara Frontier who were interested in Numismatics, which compilation had been made possible by the cooperation of helpful dealers like B. Max Mehl, Barney Bluestone, B. G. Johnson and S. H. Chapman together with the use of the A.N.A. Directory. Interest was immediately aroused as to the possibility of a club and contacts were made to test the feasibility of an organization. Within a few weeks or months a sufficient number had evinced their interest so that a preliminary meeting was called at Mr. Aldred's store. From this first gathering grew the idea of the charter meeting held May 13, 1927. Signatures to the Constitution were obtained again on May 23 and June 26, at which time the charter was closed.

Several Rochester men assisted in the formation of the new club. They came at least several times to the early meetings and brought exhibits to further the interest of the beginners. Messrs. George J. Bauer and Paul M. Lange are worthy of special mention here.

Within three years the newly formed club was to be the host to the 1930 Convention of the A.N.A. which was successful in every way, and financial success was paramount to a new club of small membership. The coming financial depression decimated the membership within a year, but interest and hard work persisted to lay a foundation of slow steady growth. The gains have not been made so much in total membership as in the increased number of steady life-time numismatists. These men were real solid collectors who had a vision of the club as a social and educational group, and whose regular attendance increased the average number at the meetings.

Early in the life of the Club, it was decided to start a cabinet of coins and medals. Because of the very large and extensive collections in the local museums, it was determined to confine the Cabinet to numismatic items of interest to the Niagara Frontier. Thru the intervening years, the Cabinet has built a very respectable collection of obscure pieces in the usual fields of endeavor, namely tokens, medals, badges and paper money. The Cabinet solicits donations and is able to make modest purchases on occasions.

Having among its members a chemist and metallurgist in the person of the late Nelson S. Hopkins of Williamsville, whose interest was mainly medals and tokens, it was natural that the club should strike its own specimen. Beginning in 1932 a club token or officers medal has been regularly issued. It was decided that the annual issues should be in contrasting metals, of even size and low in cost so as to have the widest range of appeal. Mr. Hopkins' influence appears in the unusual metals

that have been used on some issues. Magnesium used in 1934 was one of the few numismatic pieces struck in this metal. A number of alloys such as goldine, durigold, and nickel-silver make the series unusual. Since the publication of the story of these Tokens in the NUMISMATIST two years ago, a brass 1945 token and a bronze 1946 issue have been added. To commemorate this Convention a nickel-silver piece mentioning the A.N.A. has been struck.

Among the members of the B.N.A. we find some of the most prominent numismatists. Mr. Becker, now retired, sold in 1928 a choice collection of early dimes, reaching then, well into the three figure mark. His cents and half dollars were the result of thirty years careful collecting. Mr. E. A. Gilroy of Wayland, N. Y. past president and former member of the Board of Governors, A.N.A., is a most astute collector of coins and stamps, well informed, with a broad general interest in hobbies. Mr. George H. Blake, our number 13, has been lucky for the local group. For years, Treasurer of the A.N.A., he has visited in Buffalo on many occasions and obtained at least two disciples of paper money in the Club who are prominent in that field.

Member No. 24, the late Mr. Hopkins made a remarkable collection of Aviation Medals besides making a study of the Civil War Tokens or "Copper heads". His military decorations and orders were on display at a local museum for some years. Mr. Albert A. Grinnell of Detroit, Member No. 30, is the outstanding U. S. collector of Federal Currency. Some of the items in his famous collection were garnered for him by his friends in the Queen City. Member No. 34, Mr. George J. Bauer of Rochester, Past President of the A.N.A. (Buffalo 1930) has been termed the dean of American Collectors, and his display of Ancient Coins has been a prize winner on many occasions. Mr. Bauer won his first numismatic award at the Buffalo Fair and Exposition of 1888.

The late Mr. Charles Markus of Iowa, number 39, was for several years President of the A.N.A. Member No. 42 is none other than Stuart M. Mosher, our very efficient and capable editor of the NUMISMATIST. He is a past president of the Buffalo Club, wrote extensively for the local papers on Numismatics, and set up and published a description of the Knox Collection at the Buffalo Museum of Science. Number 58 is Mr. T. James Clarke of Jamestown, Past President of the A.N.A. long a promoter of Numismatics in this area. Mr. Clarke is an exhibitor at this Convention and his unusual displays are well known in the numismatic fraternity.

Mr. Jesse M. Taylor, A.N.A. District Secretary has made a very presentable collection of U. S. Pattern Coins. Mr. Franklyn J. Herrick of Syracuse has the knack of building special collections and displaying them in the best fashion. Mr. J. D. Ferguson, of Rock Island, Quebec, Past President of the A.N.A. is at work compiling a compendium of the Dominion Notes. The Buffalo Numismatic Association thus holds among its members a body of men who have made a considerable contribution to the hobby.

The Buffalo Numismatic Association has thus made its mark in twenty years of growth, its usefulness to the A.N.A. in Conventions and in Publications for the NUMISMATIST, its contributions in the Cabinet and in its badges and tokens, and in furthering the interests of many real students of the Science.

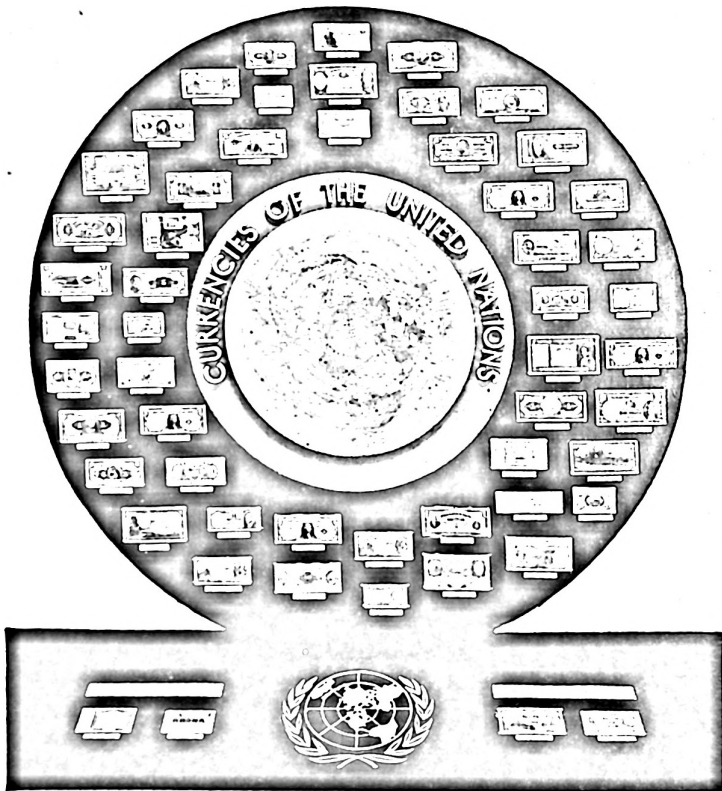

A boy of ten was given a set of English Maundy money; this started an interest in coins and the purchase of some nice Roman bronze at a penny each made him a keen collector. In 1914, at sixteen he left school and joined the Army; he served throughout the first World War and ended as a pilot in the R.A.F. Not having been trained for a trade or profession, he wondered how he could earn a living on being demobilized; he turned to his hobby and was fortunate enough immediately to obtain a post with a coin dealer in London. He did his best to learn all he could, and at the age of 25 compiled the "Milled Silver Coinage" (of England), the recognized standard work on this series.

By much plodding and hard work the company has prospered and in twenty-one years has sold over one million coins and medals, and now employs a fine team of experts. 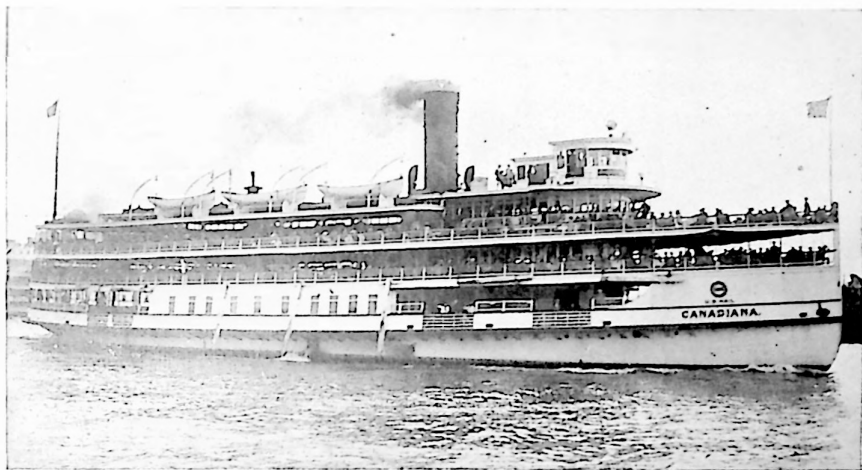

steel dedicated to international good-will, which was opened by the Prince of Wales in 1927. Once a center on which international tension was riveted, this island cropped up again in the world's new spotlight a short time ago, when it was discussed as a possible sight for the permanent home of the UNO. Navy Island was once a British Naval Yard—hence the name.

After passing through Chippewa Village, the first evidence of nature's majestic spectacle that is to follow, appears. It is the upper rapids, commencing a mile above the Niagara escarpment, where the river begins a mad desperate rush to the mighty cataract, dropping 51 feet over the course of "the last mile" to create a turbulent picture that can never be forgotten.

Stranded in the middle of the roaring, onrushing waters, oddly enough, is a black object, which has an interesting background. In 1918 during the work on one of the power plants, a tug towing a huge steel scow grounded in the river. With rare presence of mind, the two men quickly opened the bottom of the scow, forcing it to settle on the rocks. The two men were rescued on a breeches-buoy. The scow still remains on the rocks.

Upon arriving at the famous Horseshoe Falls, shortly thereafter, the group will stop-off in order to view at first hand, near the water's edge, the massive ruggedness of these Falls. This, complimented by the streamline grace of the American Falls close by, forms one of the world's top ranking wonders as it provides one of the most majestic sights the earth can offer to man. At the same time, sight-seers will have ample opportunity to walk through Queen Victoria Park which presents many extensive formal floral displays that makes it a veritable paradise. This is particularly true in August, when the rhododendrons, annuals, perennials, bulbs, dahlias and flowers of many other types are bursting beauty in full bloom. Here is a magnificent contribution to the joy of living that no lover of flowers, beauty or life will want to miss, for here dame nature wheels her finest magic unsparingly.

With the tour now half completed, all will again board the buses to start the trip back to Buffalo by first crossing the Rainbow Bridge to the American shore, thence passing through the city of Niagara Falls, N. Y., the sight-seers then weaving their way down the American shore, crossing by bridge to Grand Island, leaving same again by another bridge to Buffalo.

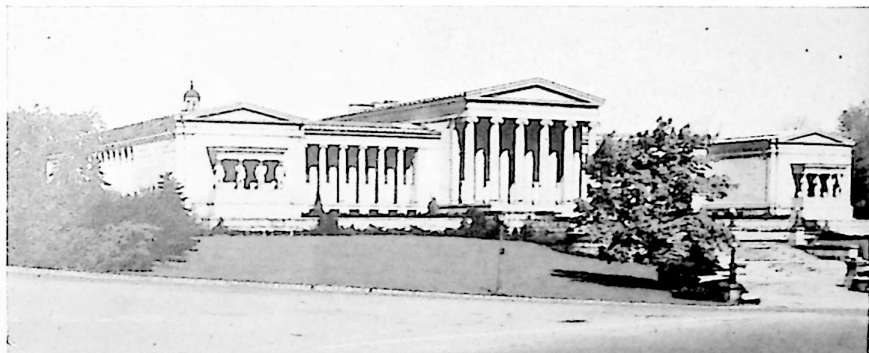

ALBRIGHT ART GALLERY

Classic Albright Art Gallery, an excellent example of purest Greek architecture, features a constantly changing collection of modern Art, providing an exhibition that is ever new and of never-failing interest.

This temple of pictorial art stands in Delaware Park a short distance from Elmwood Avenue and overlooking the Park Lake. The palatial building was provided through the generosity of John J. Albright of Buffalo, to contain the collection of the Buffalo Fine Arts Academy. It is of white marble, 250 ft. long and is the finest example of pure Greek Architecture to be found in America.

It is widely known for its sculpture collection of which the modern group is rated one of the finest in the country. In the permanent collection are outstanding modern French Paintings, while the Room of Contemporary Art, for which works may be bought from living artists, subject to exchange or resale, place the Gallery in the vanguard of American Museums.

Activities include a large schedule of out-of-town exhibitions; alternate shows by the local Buffalo Society of Artists, and an annual exhibition of work by Western New York Artists. Ten thousand reproductions and original works of art are regularly loaned to the city schools and special exhibitions are organized for the secondary school classes. Eighth grade pupils are daily taken through the Gallery by trained guides.

The Gallery maintains an Art School where courses in design, interior decoration, modeling, painting, etc., are taught; also courses for teachers, who desire to become teachers of Art Education in the schools.

The Albright Art Gallery has a quiet charm, a simple austerity, which in its park setting will be favorably received over a long period of time. Originally, such a building was designed essentially as a repository of the arts. In recent years, the efforts of the staff have been to make these resources increasingly available to the general public. At each end of the east facade are the famous Augustus St. Gaudens caryatids.

The Gallery is open daily from 10:00 A. M. to 5:30 P. M., except Sunday and Monday, when it opens at 1:00 P. M.



ROSE GARDENS IN DELAWARE PARK

After leaving the Gallery through the opposite entrance facing Delaware Park, the party will go a short distance by path and over foot bridge to the Buffalo Historical Society Museum, which stands nearby.

Vividly portraying the colorful history of the renowned Niagara Frontier and holding equally widespread fame is the beautiful museum of the Buffalo Historical Society which abounds with unusually interesting things to see, which all visiting there will quickly discover.

The Buffalo Historical Society was founded in 1862 with Millard Fillmore, 13th President of the United States as its first President. Its purpose is to discover, produce and preserve, whatever may relate to the history of Western New York in general and the City of Buffalo in particular.

The building is of white marble and a noted example of classical Greek Doric. The front entrance facing the Park Lake, is a three-quarter scale reproduction of the Parthenon. The marble was obtained from the quarries on Isle la Motte in Lake Champlain. The sculptured tablets and tympanum were executed by Edmund Amateis.

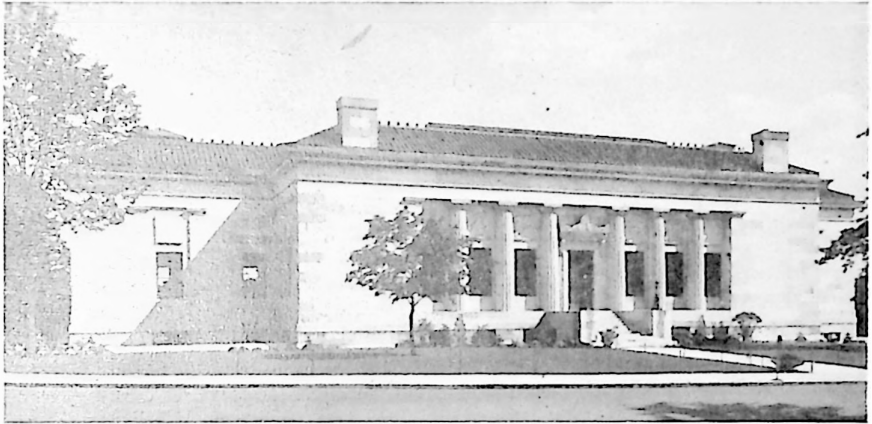

The building was erected jointly by the State of New York, the City of Buffalo and the Buffalo Historical Society in 1900, and was used by the State of New York as headquarters for its commission during the Pan-American Exposition in 1901, at the close of which it became the property of the Historical Society.

The reference library, which contains approximately 50,000 volumes and many manuscripts, is rich in source material of the Niagara Frontier.



BUFFALO HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM

One of the most interesting items in the Museum is the Apostolic Clock. It was made by Mr. Myles Hughes who presented it to the Historical Society in 1926. It strikes on the hour and indicates seconds, minutes, hours, days of week, days of month, moon phases, sunrising and setting (short or long days). As the bell strikes the hour, the door at left of the clock opens and the twelve Apostles march out in procession in front of the Saviour. All except Peter turn and bow to Him and He bows to them. Peter, turns his back on the Saviour. As he does so, a white disc, upon which is written in Latin "He denies the Saviour," appears in the background high above the Saviour's head. Before Peter approaches the Saviour, Satan the tempter, appears stealthily in the small black door over the large door to attract Peter's attention. When he apparently does so, he disappears, but immediately reappears at the right side of the clock in a similar door. All pass in and the doors close. The bell tolls during the procession. The globe revolves once every twenty-four hours.

Notable collections included in the Museum include exhibits of Iroquoian archaeology and ethnology, pioneer articles, Staffordshire china, American glass, pottery, pewter, and costumes.

Of all the Museum's general collections, the Numismatic Department is one of the most prominent, featuring numerous exhibits of coins, and medals relating specifically to the Niagara Frontier. In the items gathered here, assembled largely through the efforts of the late Dr. Frederick H. James, Colonel Laurence H. Gardner and other members and friends of the Society, experimental and colonial coins are well represented.

Except for a few specimens of the half cents, the copper coinage of the United States is complete as to dates. The nickel coinage is complete as to years of issue. The silver . . . including the three cents, half dime,

ten cents, twenty cents, twenty-five cents, fifty cents and one dollar . . . lacks only three dates, the 1802 dime and two quarters. The rare 1804 dollar, of course, is absent. Representation of Jackson cents, while not complete in all varieties, contains several examples of extremely rare specimens seldom acquired by even the most advanced collector.

The Dr. James collection which numbers several thousand pieces, is particularly strong in Civil War and tradesmen's tokens, most of which are in mint condition. The commemorative half dollars of the United States include several rarities and are, of course, mint specimens.

The Society's extensive assortment of U. S. Commemorative medals includes a splendid representation of those issued from the birth of the Republic to the present day. There are also the Presidential campaign medals, exposition medals, and many specimens of private manufacture.

Among the Indian medals is one outstanding specimen, a large engraved silver medallion that George Washington gave to Red Jacket in 1792. In this department also are the silver medals of Millard Fillmore, the Society's first President. Supplementing these and other equally unusual collections is a library complete with many numismatic periodicals.

During the party's visit in this building, Robert W. Bingham, museum director, will have a full quota of guides available for conducting visitors through the Museum in groups. Also, he has consented to give a short but very interesting talk on the highlights of his outstanding numismatic collection.

Thereafter, visitors will again board buses, traveling through Delaware Park, then through Humboldt Parkway into Humboldt Park where the Buffalo Museum of Science is located.

Far-famed for its twelve great exhibition rooms and its unique, spectacular "Glass Man", this imposing edifice will be the last to be visited on this tour.

Organized in 1861, the Buffalo Society of Natural Sciences has developed nationwide fame. After having housed its growing collections and work under several different roofs, it installed, in 1929, its exhibits and began its activities in the Buffalo Museum of Science.

Built by the City of Buffalo at a cost of \$1,000,000 this building contains the Society's collections that are valued at more than this amount. Because of its broad program of exhibits, activities, and publications, the Museum's influence now extends far beyond its immediate community. It is known throughout the United States and the world for its achievements and its progressiveness. Every year thousands of tourists who flock to the Niagara region, make it a special point to include in their stay a trip to the Museum to see the working of the "Transparent Man".

It was the first Museum in the world to work with children and to present exhibits that tell a continuous and related story of man's scientific knowledge. It was the first Museum in the country to devote halls exclusively to physics and chemistry, to astronomy, to genetics, to public health and the first in the world to trace the inter-relations of the art of pre-historic and primitive peoples through the ages. It is a pioneer in adult museum education and in evening hours to make the Museum available to business people.

Activities of the Museum include regular and special exhibits, public nights in the Kellogg Observatory, lecture series on natural science, popular science and travel; musical programs and organizations (Buffalo

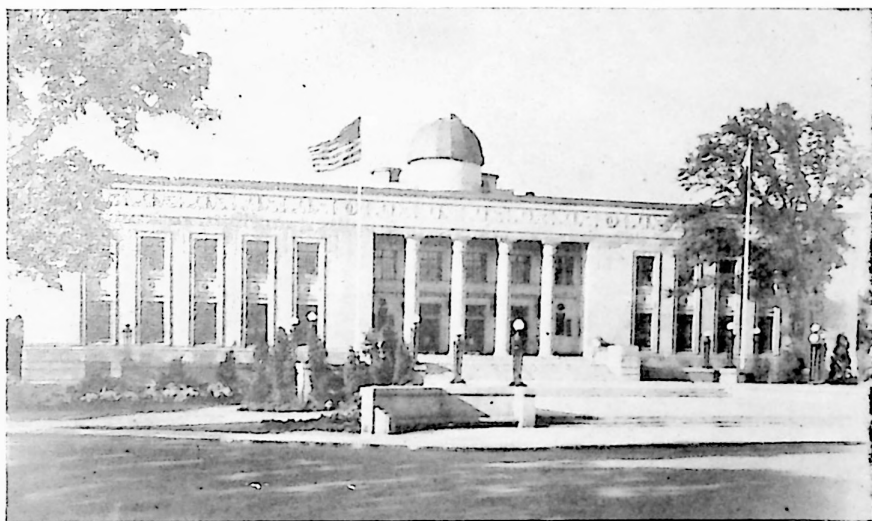

Schola Cantorum and Symphony Training Orchestra); adult evening classes, hobby clubs and scientific sections; junior clubs, classes and children's story hour.

Supplementing its permanent exhibits and loan collections which present science in brief for busy people, the Museum has a continuous stream of special exhibits.

Some of the outstanding points for visitors to see are the "Glass or Transparent Man", the Malvina Hoffman bronzes of selected racial types, the Bermuda Coral Reef group with its dancing beam of sunlight, the Hall of Conservation with its famous Spring and Autumn Wax Flowers executed by the Marchand Brothers, and the collection of Milestones of Science embracing first and early rare editions of the books epochal in the several fields of science.

Here too, are magnificent displays of coins and other numismatic material to delight Convention-goers. Of particular interest from this standpoint, are the several unusual things which have been used as media of exchange in various parts of the world.

Much of the credit for establishing this fine display, incidentally, goes to Stuart Mosher, editor of the NUMISMATIST, who played a dominant role in organizing and setting up this exhibit during his association with the Museum several years ago. Still another noteworthy collection featured in the Museum is a group of miniature representations of Indian life as it existed along the Niagara Frontier.
